## Primary PE and Sports Premium Grant

The government initially provided funding of £450 million over the 3 academic years 2013/2014, 2014/2015 and 2015/2016 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding has now been extended to run to 2020 (it was doubled in 2017 as a result of the so called 'sugar tax'). It is allocated directly to primary school head teachers.

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer pupils and schools have been given the freedom to choose how they do this; but funding must be ring fenced to show additional activities above and beyond the basic school PE curriculum. A list of possible uses has been suggested.

We carried out an internal audit of our provision as well as arranging an external evaluation and monitoring visit from a specialist PE adviser. This has helped us to decide how to use the money. Our priorities are to:

- Upskill our teaching staff and increase their confidence in teaching high quality PE and sporting activities
- To develop a curriculum map for each class to help simplify the assessment of PE
- Extend the range of sporting activities for children to experience
- Develop competitive sport in and outside the curriculum
- Increase pupils' participation in the sports and physical activities, and sign post them to higher level opportunities outside school
- To support children who show sporting talent
- Provide places for pupils on after school sports clubs
- Improve resources and equipment to support the development of PE and sporting activities
- To implement a monitoring schedule to assess progress and evaluate the impact of this funding
