

Practise using your Daily Sentence Structures in your writing! Here they are as a reminder:

Simple Sentence

He trembled.

Her eyes twinkled.

I gulped.

Compound Sentence

She gasped as she opened the shiny box.

His heart sank as he heard the news.

Complex Sentence

The dog, who was wagging his tail happily, barked at the postman!

Henry, who was dancing energetically, stopped to catch his breath.

Verb Complex Sentence

Jumping up and down excitedly, Jenny celebrated her goal.

Running too quickly, James tripped and fell flat on the gravel.

Question / Afterthought Sentence

What was that noise? he thought to himself.

What is happening? I thought to myself.

Deducing Sentence

You could tell I was excited as I punched the air!

You could tell he was worried as he trembled and sighed.

See if you can generate some more sentences of each type, just as we have been doing in school.
